PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

With FFRPL's support, the Rochester Public Library now has more than **450** *Raising A Reader* families participating, at 13 sites, City-wide.

In Spring 2018, we sponsored and hosted the 32nd Annual Sokol High School Literary Awards, which recognizes the best poetry, prose and performance submissions from young writers across the county, judged by nationally-known authors. In 2018, we received 124 entries: 17 Monroe County schools were represented, and homeschoolers were encouraged to apply as well. Winners came from School of the Arts, Pittsford Sutherland HS, Rush-Henrietta HS, and Penfield HS.

Through a generous music lover's gift, FFRPL sponsored the free *June Jazz Combos*, held in Central Library's Dorris Carlson Reading Garden at Central Library Downtown.

Since 2001, FFRPL has provided critical funding through grants and donations for *Safe to be*

Smart, the Library's out-of-school-time program housed in six City library branches (including Central). For 2017-18, Safe to be Smart had a total of 54,263

recorded youth interactions. Youth received help with home-work, job applications, and career guidance, and accessed Library resources including books and wi-fi.

FFRPL celebrated **62** years of our legacy program Books Sandwiched In, and also maintained our Winter Tuesday Topics series, featuring expert speakers on current issues that were particularly critical in our community.

Through the Harold Hacker Fund for the Advancement of Libraries, FFRPL sponsored the May the 4th Be With You event (Spring 2018) at Central as part of RPL's Libraries After Dark series of after-hours themed parties. Patrons solved the Star Wars challenges in our Escape Room; viewed rare cult-classic Star Wars themed films; enjoyed stellar tunes; and learned lightsaber skills at Jedi Combat Training.

FFRPL contributed to the 13th Annual Greater Rochester Teen Book Festival held at Nazareth College in May 2018, which was attended by 1,700 teens from grades 6-12. TBF 2018 featured more than 25 authors including New York Times and USA Today bestsellers, local teen authors, and an audiobook narrator.

FFRPL supported many Youth Programs this past fiscal year, such as the Rochester Children's Book Festival at MCC (we manage their finances as an in-kind service); Family Arts Days at Sully and Wheatley branches, Summer Reading programs, and the Greater Rochester Teen Read. FFRPL collaborated with the Monroe County Library System, Kodak Center and Barnes & Noble Pittsford on the SOLD OUT Rochester leg of the Rick Riordan *Ship of the Dead* Tour. More than 1,700 teens and their chaperones welcomed *NYT*

bestselling author Rick Riordan to Rochester at the Kodak Center in October 2017. Free tickets were



distributed throughout MCLS, and 'sold out' in less than 24 hours.

FFRPL hosted Pulitzer Prizewinning journalist Amy Goldstein in November 2017 for our annual Publishers' Circle Library Celebration Dinner, novelist and memoirist Reyna Grande in partnership with Writers & Books as part of Rochester Reads in March 2018; and award-winning adventurer Jennifer Pharr Davis in April 2018.

In FY2017-18, FFRPL sponsored RCTV's 7th annual *90-Second Newbery Film Festival*. The program was originally started by James Kennedy, author of *The Order of Odd-Fish*, who challenged young filmmakers to select a Newbery-winning book and turn it into a 90-second video. In March 2018, James Kennedy helped host the screenings at the Dryden Theatre in the George Eastman Museum.

In March 2018, renovations began on the former Rundel Auditorium, and when completed the space was renamed the Kusler-Cox Auditorium in recognition of Alan Kusler and William H. Cox, Jr., two librarians with distinguished careers at RPL who left the FFRPL its second-largest bequest in our organization's history. The extensive work included a new ceiling, lighting, carpet and window shades; a new, single room partition; new AV systems for the main room and partitioned rooms; asbestos abatement and removal; HVAC upgrades; new tables & chairs; and repaired/ refreshed wood finishes.

At the end of FY2017-18, FFRPL exceeded our \$1.4-million fundraising goal for the Library's From Collections To Community Capital Campaign, with additional funds from Library, City, County and NY State partners. The final phase of the project, slated for Winter 2020, will be a Technology Center, with meeting/conference areas and makerspaces for creation and collaboration.

This past fiscal year, FFRPL continued to help maintain and improve the Library's specialized spaces, such as the Dorris Carlson Reading Garden, imagine YOU Digital Media Learning Lab, and Teen Central. We also helped beautify branch spaces with special community projects, such as the murals we helped fund at the Arnett and Douglass branches.



SPECIAL PROJECTS & EXHIBITIONS

FFRPL funded a comprehensive study with the NYC-based Hester Street Collaborative for a needs and facilities assessment of RPL Branch Libraries. During the community engagement process, key library stakeholders identified optimal facility service models, including locations, sizes and types of potential future library facilities and outlets. The study was concluded in late 2018, and the implementation of many initial suggestions is already underway.

This past fiscal year, FFRPL helped fund a bus to Albany for the New York Library **Association Advocacy Day** 2018. Board members, staff and Friends representing libraries throughout Monroe County joined over 1,000 library advocates from all over the state to meet with elected representatives and demonstrate their support for libraries. They collectively held meetings with over 75% of the NYS Legislature, which resulted in the first increase in state library aid since 2016, and a remarkable \$10M increase in public library construction funding.

FFRPL supported the 201718 Central Library exhibition
Because of Women Like Her...
Winning the Vote in New York
State through grants, gifts and the
Walter F. Becker Fund for Local
History. More than 28,000 visitors
to Central learned about the
history of the women's suffrage
movement during the exhibition,
and traveling versions have been
seen by 200,000 more throughout
Monroe County.





For the 2017 Fringe Festival, FFRPL presented River to Roof Tours and Spooky Stories in the Stacks, and helped support the Roc Bottom Slam Poets, a Murder Mystery, and a Digital Drawing demonstration at Central Library.

FFRPL helped support the first annual Anthony Mascioli Rainbow Dialogues (March 2018), a series of conversations that helped contextualize LGBTQ+ life in Rochester against the backdrop of local and national social justice issues.

Since 2011, FFRPL has sponsored Art of the Book, Central Library's juried international art exhibition and competition. The 7th annual exhibition was on view November 1, 2017-January 8, 2018 in the Anthony Mascioli Gallery, and featured 62 entries from six countries.

FFRPL helped fund this year's annual staff training for the **Chester F. Carlson Patent &** Trademark Resource Center.

SUPPLEMENTAL MATERIALS & EQUIPMENT

FFRPL funded the purchase of supplemental Library materials, including books, DVD's, audiobooks and ebooks.

This past fiscal year, FFRPL helped fund the creation of themed Toy Library learning backpacks, two additional sewing machines for the Arts Division, and popular Empire Passes for free vehicle entry into NYS Parks – all available for loan.

Through the successful Retirees' Challenge, FFRPL raised money to help fund online Overdrive eBook purchases for MCLS.


